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### Lecturers

#### Hallvard Fossheim

University of Bergen, Norway

H.Fossheim is a Professor of philosophy at the University of Bergen. He has served as Director of NESH at the National Research Ethics Committees of Norway, and has published widely in the history of philosophy and ethics.

#### **Nicolas Dintzner**

Delft University of Technology, The Netherlands

Nicolas is currently working as data steward of the Faculty of Technology, Policy, and Management, at the Delft University of Technology. His role is to assist and advise researchers with data-related challenges – from preparation of projects (DMPs mostly) to archival of their research results. Nicolas also participates in training sessions on data management and software development for researchers. Before this, Nicolas worked as a software engineer in the private sector, and continued with a PhD in software engineering (configurable software) at the Delft University of Technology.

Wim Blokzijl was born in 1971 in The Netherlands. He studied Dutch Language and Literature and has been lecturing communication skills at Delft University of Technology for over twenty years.
