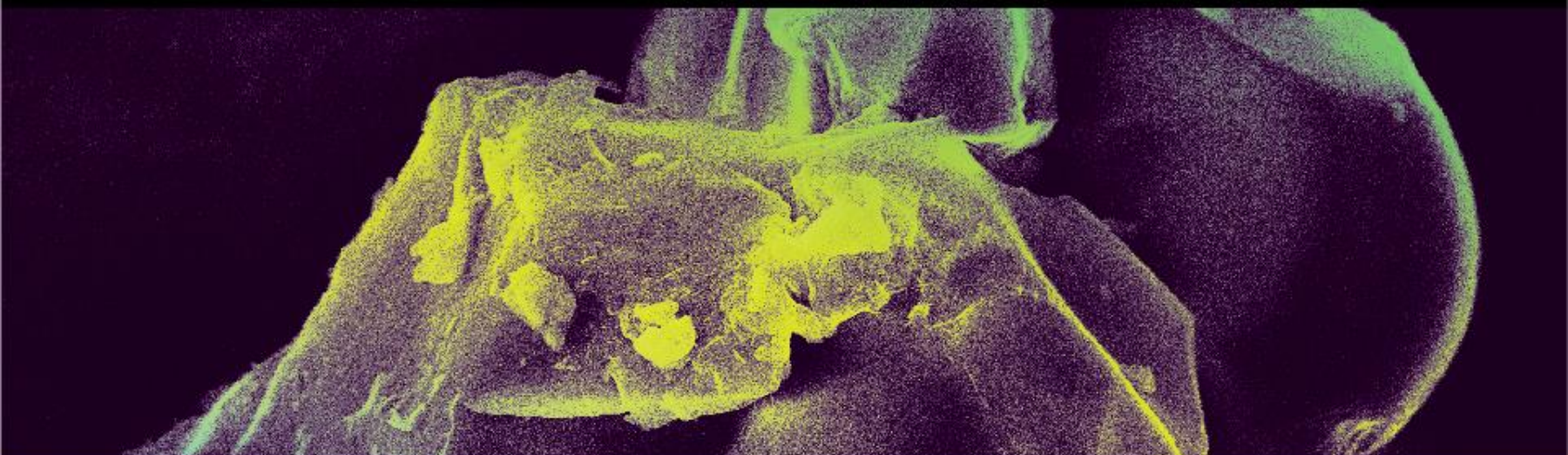

The language of Summer School is English. In order to participate, doctoral students should have sufficient language skills.

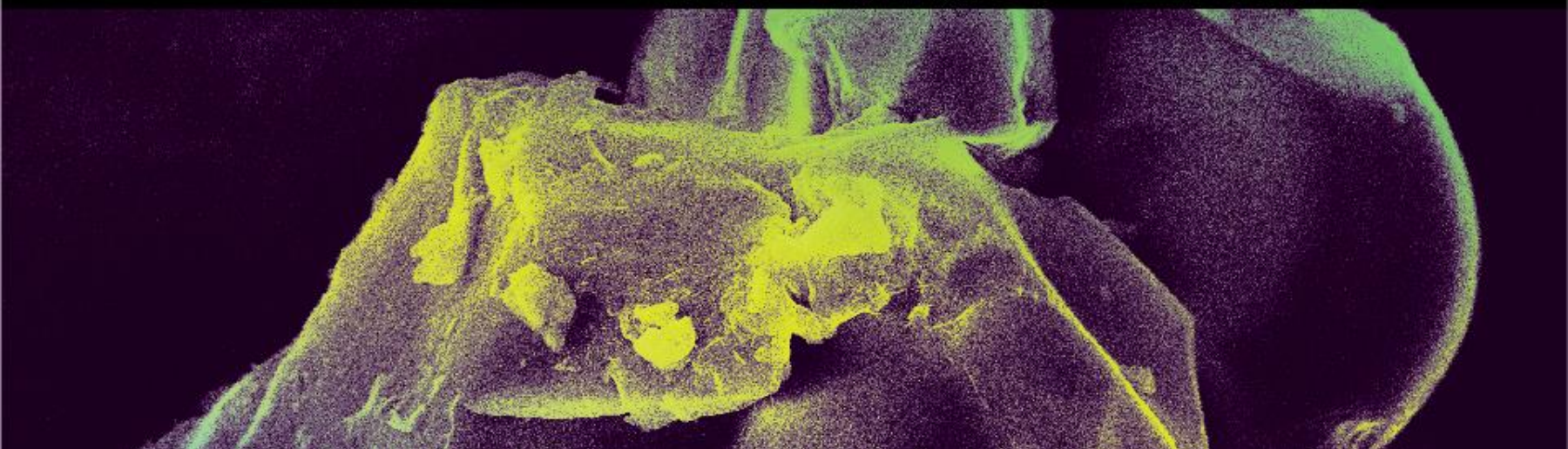

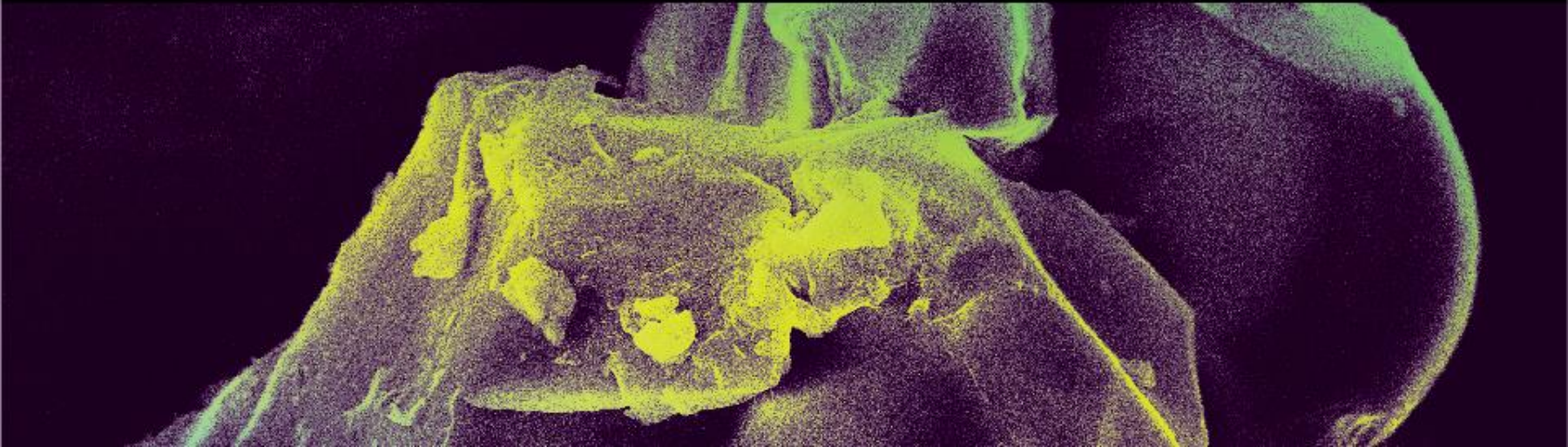

University of Bergen, Norway

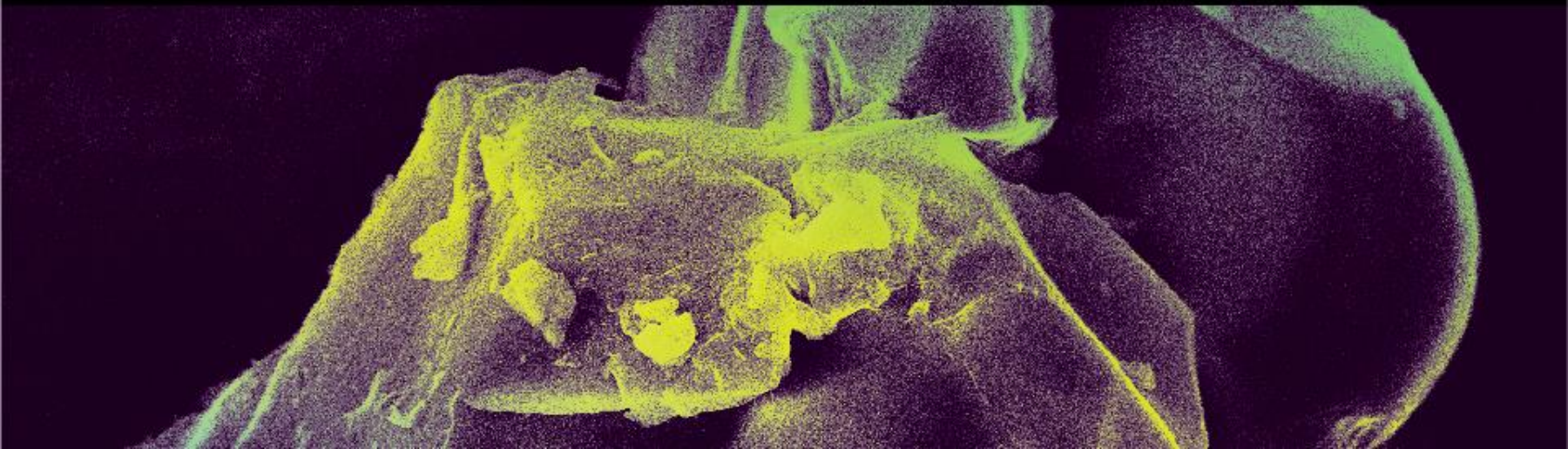

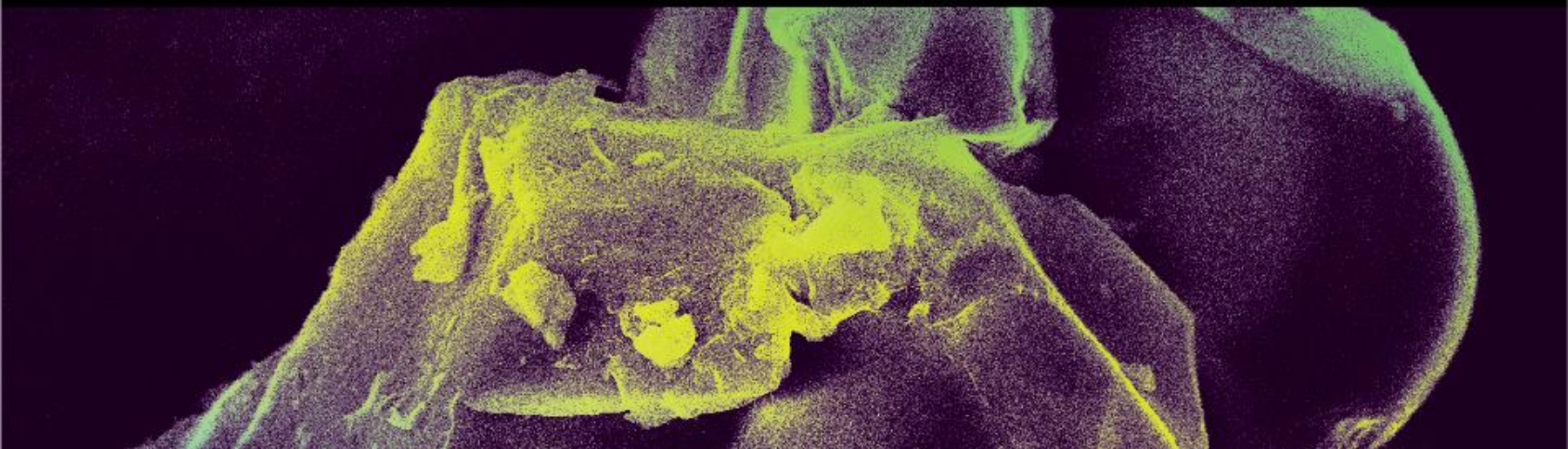
Frank Witlox

Traditionally, poster sessions take place in a physical space. We invite you to participate virtually.

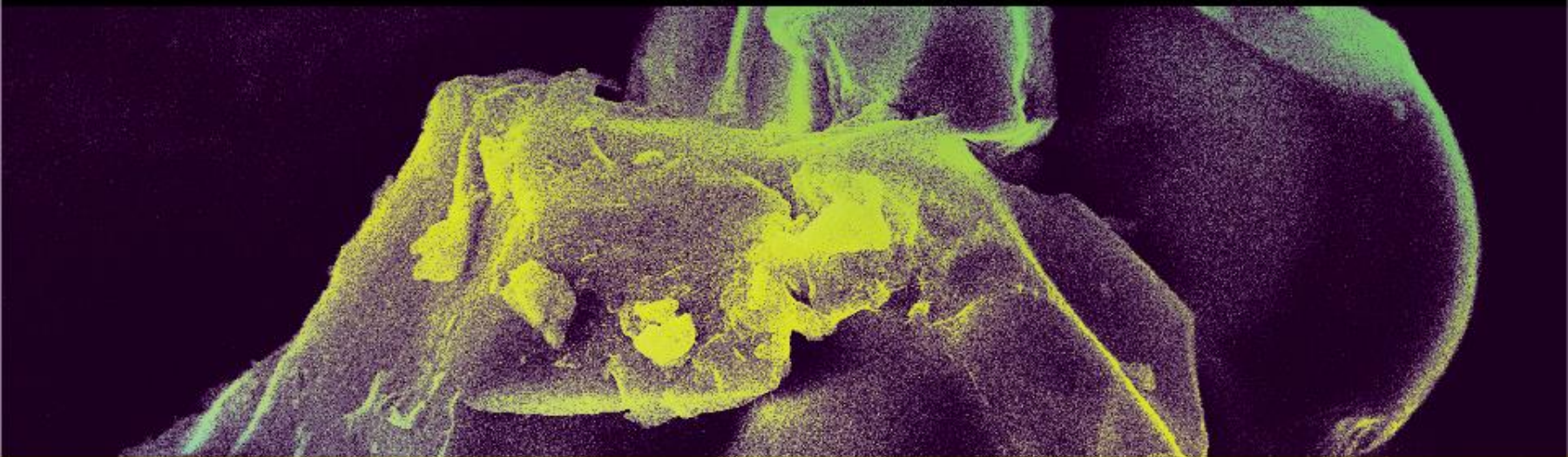
The aim of this session is to develop your science communication skills presenting your research to a diverse audience

- to prepare a speech that cannot be longer than 2 minutes, and during the poster session to present this speech to other participants of the PhD Summer School.

Participants of the session will have a possibility to compete for awards in 4 categories (details will be published in our newsletter). Winners will be announced in the Closing Ceremony.

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
